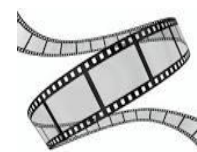
### FILM AND CAKE

Greetings from Bloxwich!

I'm now three months into my new post as Team Rector of Bloxwich Parish. We're in the West Midlands – in the archdeaconry of Wolverhampton in the Diocese of Lichfield.

There are three churches in the parish – All Saints, which sits on the High Street, and two churches serving the housing estates on the edge of Bloxwich – Holy Ascension and St Thomas's. There are some wonderful folk in our congregations, but the pandemic and a lengthy vacancy have taken their toll on the numbers of worshippers and our outreach. Each church has its own character, which I'm getting to know. Each has their own challenges, which are also becoming apparent! Our financial situation is fragile and we have major expenses to meet. At All Saints, our boiler has broken and needs replacing, our clock tower leaks and our church hall is out of action after a pipe burst and flooded the hall.

But there is much to be glad about – people in Bloxwich are proud of their church and many families are inquiring about baptisms and weddings. I have a great bunch of colleagues in the Ministry Team, and we have all sorts of dreams about how our churches can be beacons of God's love in the communities they serve.

We put on a full programme of Christmas services despite Covid, and now we're looking forward to playing our part in the Week of Christian Unity, when we will be joining with our brothers and sisters in the other churches across Bloxwich and neighbouring Blakenall to share in worship and fellowship. “Embrace change and allow the Holy Spirit to surprise us”

Nancy has settled in well – and we have a new puppy – a Staffie called Cooper (he's orange and brown like the marmalade!). We've also discovered that living in the Midlands makes holidays in the Peak District and Wales much easier!

In closing, could I thank you all for your kind words as we departed Epsom, and for all your Christmas cards and gifts – we appreciate that we're still in your thoughts and prayers. And if anyone fancies a mini-break in the West Midlands you'd be very welcome.
