3rd Epsom (St. Martin's) Scout Group

Summary of matters discussed at the PCC Meeting, 31st March 2022

Please note: The minutes of the meeting have yet to be agreed at the next PCC meeting. They will then be published in full.

1. Health and Safety: We have responded to the diocesan request to review covid protection measures. We are acting in accordance with current guidelines.

2. Safeguarding: Retraining needed by some individuals. They have been informed.

3. Matters arising from the last PCC minutes:

John Aronson is stepping down from his role as Adults' Safeguarding Officer. This vacancy needs to be filled.

The steps to the car park have been repaired. The County Council has still to be approached for a contribution to the expense.

The reintroduction of the Communion chalice will be delayed until infection rates fall significantly.

4. Correspondence:

£300 will be donated to the Guildford Diocesan Guild of Church Bell Ringers Restoration Fund.

A communique will be prepared to explain to all members of the church the decision to spend £1000 of church funds on historical research relating to the Brathwaite memorial and slavery.

5. Finance: Thanks to John Syrad's generous legacy and one-off government grants, a deficit of only £9,346 was recorded for 2021. These will not recur in 2022; a deficit of around £60,000 is expected.

6. Stewardship: There was support for the idea of a monthly or quarterly report to the congregation on the state of the church's finances. A more detailed breakdown of expenditure might encourage giving to cover specific needs.

7. Permission to Officiate: Howard Bluett's relicensing as an LLM approved.

8. APCM: Revised date of May 1st confirmed. 11.30am in Church House.

9. Racial Justice Focus Group: Peter Brathwaite's talk was summarised. Ideas for a liturgical and educational response to the church's connection with historic slavery were outlined.

10. Fabric:

The architect's inspection found no significant problems in either St Martin's church or St Stephen's church.

Negotiations are under way for a potential new tenant for St John Chandler Hall.

Negotiations are continuing regarding the renewal of the Langley Vale Village Hall lease.

Proposals to install a dishwasher under the servery were confirmed.

11. Living in Love and Faith: A proposal relating to the ongoing debate within the CofE with regard to same-sex marriage in church will be put to the next PCC. The weekly newsletter will ask for responses from the congregation on this subject before the PCC next meets.

12. Church House: Discussion of the plan for improvement was deferred. Bookings of rooms look set to increase.

13. Staffing Review: An HR company has been appointed and is ready to start work.

14. Eco-Church: The diocese has requested us to look at our eco-footprint. Helen Williams accepted the role of Environmental Sustainability Officer.

15. Vacancy for Church Warden: John Flower was thanked for his service over the past years.
