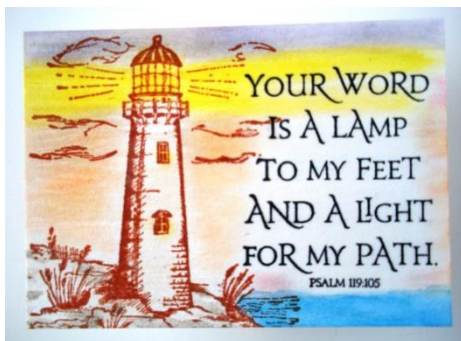

*'The Bible says we will always have the poor –
Does that mean we shouldn't do anything about them?'*

We will explore around what should our response be to the poor in our society - as Christians should that be different to others and is it things that we do and support that keep people in poverty. How do we challenge what happens and have we got ingrained in patterns of behaviour and therefore cannot see the impact of them?

Jonathan writes: 'For ten years I ran Generation Church, stepping down in 2020, and in 2012 we launched the foodbank with a lot of support. This has sadly grown and grown. Our mission is now to close the foodbank but to do that we have to explore the roots of poverty, how we live our lives, how we make decisions and how can we lift people out of poverty. These are the areas that we are grappling with on a day today basis as we try to turn the tide.'
