'Enslavement voices from the Archives' - An exhibition at Lambeth Palace

This exhibition of letters, books and documents sheds light on the links between the Church and the slave trade. One of the most haunting exhibits is a Bible produced for slaves that removed all references to freedom and escape from enslavement. As we have our own 'document' to this now troubling link in the form of the wall memorial to slave owner John Brathwaite, a visit to this exhibition will help to put it in context.

In addition, our present intention is to also have three light and informal lunches during the winter with homemade soup, rolls, cheese, and fruit. The lunches would be held in Church House at 1.00 p.m. on a weekday. But note that our plans are at an early stage just now and are not, unlike the Commandments, engraved in stone.
