This is an important day in the Church calendar, when we give thanks for the sacrament of Holy Communion.

- 6.30pm Second Thoughts at St Martin's 'Out of Sight, Out of Mind? Remembering Epsom's Forgotten Residents Alana Harris

Dr Alana Harris is a Reader in Modern British History at King's College London. Her research interests span the history of contemporary Christianity, life histories, and the interplay of gender, sexuality and race in twentieth-century British society.

Did you know that the largest cluster of psychiatric hospitals in Europe was in Epsom? And that the unclaimed bodies of over 9000 pauper psychiatric patients who died in these facilities are buried in a local graveyard known as Horton cemetery? Following sale of the land in 1983, the site (at the intersection of Hook Road and Horton Lane) was abandoned and the lives of these people forgotten – their graves unmarked and their stories unremembered.

This session will introduce a dynamic community project, partfunded by Historic England, to recapture these life histories and create a crowd-sourced memorial, overcoming historical amnesia, neglect and inaction.

Alongside discussion of the history of the Epsom Cluster, and the activities of volunteer researchers undertaking archival and genealogical research to reconstruct the lives and experiences of patients confined to the various asylums or 'epileptic colony', this session will take the form of a 'chat and craft' workshop. We will discuss changing attitudes to mental health and psychiatric treatment across the twentieth century and paint a ceramic flower to commemorate a patient. 900 flowers, to mark the 9000 buried, will be installed around the periphery of the cemetery on 10 October 2023.

My Ordination at Guildford Cathedral on Sunday 2nd July

As many of you know, I will be ordained Deacon at Guildford Cathedral on Sunday 2 July. The service will start at 10.30 am. It will be livestreamed for those who are unable to attend in person.

I am arranging a buffet lunch back in Epsom at Church House afterwards to which everyone is invited from about 1.45 pm (the exact timing will depend on how long it takes to get back from the Cathedral). Please could you let me know if you are coming to the lunch so that I can advise the caterer of numbers. There will also be drinks and nibbles after our 6.30 pm Holy Communion service that evening. I hope as many people as possible will be able to come to that as well.

It's been an amazing journey so far, but there's still a lot ahead in the next few weeks so please continue to pray for me as I travel this final stage towards my first ordination. **Judith Mitchell**

Young Carers are often the forgotten people as they are not obvious in Society. They can be anyone, from a very young age who supports someone in their own family in multiple roles. They do need support in order to cope in their isolated situations. My Time for young Carers is a charity, relying on enough volunteers to provide activities outside of the home, to mix with others and take part in fun activities. It is accessible for young Carers between the ages of 7-16, who live locally.

The Medaille Trust

This organisation provides refuges and freedom to victims of modern slavery—supporting them as they rebuild their lives. Today, we are one of the largest provider of supported safe house beds for victims of Modern Slavery in the UK. The scheme works to combat modern slavery by offering safe housing, providing support for victims, raising awareness in communities,

and partnering with law enforcement authorities.
