This week we focus on the sacrament of anointing, This has been practised by the Church since apostolic times, and is a sign of God's healing love in a person's life, a blessing in suffering and a desire for healing.

The protestant Church stopped this practice after the reformation, but in recent times it has been rediscovered as a powerful sign of God's grace in our lives, rather than a superstition - as the Reformers regarded it.

All who attend the 10am on Sunday (23<sup>rd</sup>) are invited to receive anointing after communion.

The five main goals of our Plan are these:

- Building for the future creating space for church and community
- Explore small groups afresh as a way of growing faith
- Increase financial giving

As we work towards these goals you will notice some changes and some new things happening. Some of the changes and happenings have already begun, some will be soon, others will be on a longer timescale. We will keep you updated. Most of all we hope you will support our efforts and, where possible, get involved so that you can be a part of the future of St Martin's and St Stephen's.
