St Martin's Choir at Portsmouth Cathedral

As part of our periodic cathedral singing mission and as a final

'hurrah' before the summer break, we sang the services at Portsmouth Cathedral last weekend whilst the cathedral's own choir was on holiday.

Hearty singing from our men's voices led the music for



Choral Evensong on Saturday and the full choir joined us for the Sunday services of Sung Communion and Evensong. The cathedral in Portsmouth is located very much in the heart of the old city and shares an integral part of the extensive naval and fishing history there. Indeed, last Sunday's eucharist included the annual commemoration devotions for all of the ship's company lost on the Mary Rose which sank on 19th July,1545.



As always on these visits, the choir acquitted themselves admirably by singing with total commitment, and lain's masterful organ playing on a very different instrument was typically brilliant and inspiring. We received many appreciative comments from worshippers and cathedral staff who also enjoyed a selection of music by Epsom composers, including, Helen Williams' anthem 'Love is the Key, lain's Preces and responses, 'Angel Voices' by Felton Rapley (DoM 1948-65) and my Missa brevis.



The cathedral trips play an important role in binding the choir together socially and musically, while also waving a flag for the parish of Epsom and St Martin. Our cathedral tally since 2017 includes visits to Winchester, Chichester, Southwark, Rochester, Guildford, Chelmsford and now Portsmouth, with Canterbury and St Alban's in our sights for the future!

CHURCH DEVELOPMENT PLAN – UPDATE

All churches in the diocese have been asked to come up with a Development Plan. We presented our draft Plan earlier this year and welcomed your comments. You may have been wondering what has happened with it. Well, since then our Plan has evolved and details, means and methods discussed. It has been approved by the Archdeacon and adopted by the PCC. The five main goals of our Plan are these:

- Growing a younger congregation: children and families and younger adults
- Communicate effectively with each other and the community
- Building for the future creating space for church and community
- Explore small groups afresh as a way of growing faith
- Increase financial giving

As we work towards these goals you will notice some changes and some new things happening. Some of the changes and happenings have already begun, some will be soon, others will be on a longer timescale. We will keep you updated. Most of all we hope you will support our efforts and, where possible, get involved so that you can be a part of the future of St Martin's and St Stephen's.
