#### **Music this Sunday**

The gradual hymn this weekend is 'Breathe on me breath of God' set to the tune Afflatus by Gilbert Stocks. Stocks was DoM at Repton School (1912-34) and wrote his own hymns for use in chapel, combining popular words with popular tunes, or writing his own tunes to familiar words. His most famous arrangement of a melody from Parry's oratorio Judith, is 'Dear Lord and Father of mankind' which became a world-wide favourite.

"Malawi: challenges to survival in a beautiful natural world". This would give blanket cover to talk about what it takes to get through life in Malawi: the economic and financial challenges, the practical and medical challenges, the social challenges - all within the framework of a strong religious influence on life.

Neither of our speakers knew much about Malawi twelve months ago. Laurence, a former modern languages teacher, gained some first-hand experience of life in Ethiopia a few years ago but knew nothing of southern Africa, while Belinda, a retired paediatric physiotherapist, had encountered life in southern Africa before but her experience was fifty years out of date! So, this inevitably will be a subjective impression of present-day life in Malawi, based on Belinda's two-month-long experience working voluntarily in the CURE hospital in Blantyre, supplemented by a collection of random insights garnered from chatting to diverse people during a two-week tour of scenically beautiful southern Malawi.

# Pilgrimage for the planet – Saturday 9th September

I will be going on a pilgrimage for the planet on the morning of Saturday 9th September and I invite you to walk with me. The route is about five miles long and includes some rough (field) terrain, so please wear suitable clothing and take care. I expect we will complete the pilgrimage in three hours or under; my plan is to gather at St Martin's at 9am, and return there by noon. Please ensure donations are sealed, in date and do not contain alcohol.


