The Gospel of John for the 21st Century: an evening with Professor David Ford, Thursday 26 October, 7.30pm – 9pm (doors open 7pm) at Guildford Cathedral Our Diocese's Local Ministry Programme, in partnership with Guildford Cathedral, are building a Theology Hub, a new learning experience and community for theologians and the theological curious.

Whether you are a little bit interested or have spent years studying, Theology Hub is a series of events and opportunities to gather people around theology. Activities include lectures delving into topics we grapple with, smaller seminars to debate and discuss, and new ways to connect with other theologians and support one another.

The first lecture, *The Gospel of John for the 21st Century: an evening with Professor David Ford*, will take place in the Lady Chapel at Guildford Cathedral on Thursday 26 October, 7.30 – 9pm (doors open at 7pm).
