## Canon Rob Esdaile *The Sword and the Cloak:*St. Martin, Armistice Day and the Gospel of Peace

We gather in a building dedicated to St. Martin of Tours, described in some quarters as 'the first Christian conscientious objector'; and we gather on Remembrance Sunday, recalling the eleventh hour of the eleventh day in 1918, when the guns fell silent ... on the Feast of St. Martin. Can St. Martin speak to us today in a Europe riven by armed conflict? And how should our responses as Christians to questions of peace and war differ from those of our non-Christian neighbours?

Canon Rob Esdaile is a presbyter of the Roman Catholic diocese of Arundel & Brighton and has been parish priest of Woking and Knaphill since September, 2022.
