

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE PCC

At our PCC meeting this week, it was decided:

- 1. To sell the John Chandler Hall for residential development. The hall has been leased to a nursery for some years, but that lease expires in Spring 2024, resulting in a loss of £50,000 a year in income. Leasing again has proved unfeasible, as the hall is in poor repair, and so a sale for new homes seemed the best way forward. At the same time, we could enable the scouts to expand their facilities at the back of the site. The Hall is in a conservation zone, so the outward appearance would be maintained. Lots of considerations along the way to completion, but this is the direction of travel agreed to.
- To go ahead with external repair works to Church House. Windows, rainwater goods, yard and frontal drainage all need attention. The monies for these works have been earmarked from a legacy received a while ago. Hopefully works can begin in 2024.
- To automate the winding of the bell tower clock. Two people are required to make considerable physical effort currently, these being two people from the bell ringing team. Grants will be sought towards the cost.
- 4. To purchase a defibrillator for Church (with 50% grant funding).
- To agree a form of words for a free-standing information notice to go by the Brathwaite memorial, explaining the links to the slave trade. PCC had already agreed to erect a memorial to those people enslaved, and this will help

- visitors understand more about the relevant history of slavery and the reason for the new memorial.
- To adopt a Parish Environmental Policy. This will be displayed in Church in due course. Helen Williams is our eco-champion and can give people more details and background information.

Other matters from the meeting:

- David Eggett will be standing down as Churchwarden from next year's APCM. The process of finding a new warden will begin in the new year, but do pray for candidates to come forward.
- The process of appointing a new Director of Music is ongoing, with interviews planned for early January.
- Our Health and Safety policy is being updated, in particular the procedure for reporting accidents.
 More to follow on this.
- A brochure of study, fellowship and prayer groups for 2024 is being produced.
- Finally, a reminder that all PCC and committee
 minutes are posted on our website, and physical
 copies placed in Church. I am aware that this has
 fallen behind tis year, for which my apologies, but it
 will be updated very soon.
