During the talk I will look at why Spinnaker believe that Schools ministry is so important; what we are trying to achieve by ministering in schools, and how the local church can be involved in this important mission field'.

Lisa Bell is the youth and children's worker at Epsom Baptist, where she contributes to the spiritual growth and development of young minds. Born in the UK, Lisa's journey took an exciting turn as she lived in South Africa for three decades, immersing herself in diverse cultures and communities. Her commitment to fostering a nurturing and inclusive environment is evident in her role as the Spinnaker Epsom hub leader, where she leads and coordinates various activities and programmes.

Lisa holds a Bachelor of Theology (BTH) degree. Additionally, she has earned a Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE), underscoring her dedication to effective teaching and mentorship.


