	if legacies are taken out the finances we would have only just broken even. It should be noted that legacy isn't a consistent source of income. Noted that we have seen the change in the energy prices this year and our utility bills have increased significantly.
	AA queries the classification of insurance money as an income. AR has checked with the

charity accounting rules and this has been correctly recorded.

Settlement of insurance claims

- 5.53. An insurance claim must be recognised when a charity has established its entitlement to the reimbursement of the insured loss, the receipt of that reimbursement is virtually certain and its amount can be measured reliably.
- 5.54. Receipt is virtually certain when an offer of settlement is received from the insurer. The insurance settlement is recognised at the fair value receivable, which will normally be the settlement amount agreed with the insurer if this is available at the reporting date.
- 5.55. A charity must recognise the amount of the insurance reimbursement either as an item of other income or by offsetting it against the related expense heading in the SoFA. The amount reimbursed through an insurance claim is recognised as an addition to the fund that initially suffered the insured loss.

12 Contested Heritage Project Update - update from JM.

I'd like to thank everyone who was involved in yesterday's service to commemorate the Victims of Slavery and the Transatlantic Slave Trade. Those who were there in church remarked that it was a very moving service. Peter Brathwaite and Bishop Christopher Herbert gave inspiring talks. In the service, those present, on behalf of St Martin's, Remembered the tragedy of slavery and honoured its victims, we Repented and lamented the sins and cruelties of the past, and the racism and injustice that humanity still inflicts on each other today, and we Committed ourselves in prayer and action to doing what we can towards Repairing the damage that slavery has brought to our world. When I checked our YouTube page, the service had had 79 views.

This afternoon I was interviewed by Dr Bethany Else, Leverhulme Early Career Fellow, at the School of Social and Political Sciences, University of Lincoln. She is conducting an in-depth research study on the Church of England's efforts to respond to the issues of contested heritage: **Reckoning for Racial Justice? A study of the impact of addressing colonial pasts**. This research will help the Church of England to understand the ways in which their work offers an example of good practice and will explore what it is that places limits on this work of reckoning with the past.

Regarding our plans for the new memorial, I am in the process of arranging a visit to St Martin's by a potential artist.

We will also be working on organising this year's Brathwaite Lecture which will take place at 3 pm on Saturday 12 July, during the weekend when we are celebrating our Patronal Festival.

c. St Stephen's - Gable End - Project Update

Costs have increased significantly by £60k. NP gives a summary of the previous discussions that have taken place with the LVVH association who weren't keen to be in partnership with one building but were keen to have use of the church for community activities during the week. Noted that the previous valuation for the land given by Mark Everett was £650k.

PCC decides to put together a mission plan about how to minister to the Langley Vale community. All members voted in favour of this next step. **ACTION: NP to write a pastoral letter to the St Stephen's community**
